The extravagant motifs and opulent finishes of art deco offer a welcome break from muted minimalism. Get on board for the latest revival

When they need a shorthand for luxury, interior designers often reach for the extravagant motifs and opulent materials of art deco. Want to go grand and glam? Summon up the *style moderne*, with streamlined shapes, fan patterns, dashes of chrome and pinches of cubism, as well as geometrics, leopards and allusions to the pyramids.

This spring, the bizarre tropes of the design movement of the 1920s and 1930s are back on the radar of decorators and retailers, partly thanks to a show that opened this month at the V&A. Ocean Liners: Speed and Style (until June 17; <a href="wam.ac.uk">wam.ac.uk</a>) is an exhibition about the "golden age of ocean travel", when one would naturally pack a Cartier tiara in the Goyard trunk for a transatlantic voyage.
